


2nd grade students celebrated Grandparent's Day. Students were able to showcase their leprechaun traps and share with all of our special guests.





Board of Education Update

At February's meeting:

Mr. Ditty presented to the Board some students from his Middle School Robotics class and what they have been working on this year. This is the first year the MS has offered the

Hollis and Miller presented an update on some of the bond projects happening throughout the district. An update was provided on the furniture selection and budget for each of the buildings.
