


5th and 6th grade students at PHIS completed a 13 foot-long collaborative mural over the span of

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
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Before the Homecoming Parade, the FFA cooked and served tacos to the PHHS staff in appreciation for all they do. Then they rode in the parade (pictured above)!

#### **Board of Education Update**

At the October Board Meeting, Mrs. Lori Burbee presented to the Board teachers Codie Lubke, Ariana Meehan, Audrey Horn and Assistant Principal Dr. Monica Pickett. These staff members presented to the Board an overview of the PBIS program at the Elementary School. Student leaders Paisley Lubke, Reid Monath, Ali Beecher, and Jase Smith joined the staff and shared the different activities they do to help promote positive behavior in their building. These student leaders led the group in their PBIS everyday pledge (pictured right with Board President Todd Wilson).

Mr. Greg Reeves presented to the Board the Middle School PE Teacher, Mr. Austen Cummins. Mr. Cummins shared with the Board some changes he has made to the PE program at the Middle School this year. The Middle School now offers three different types of PE class to students, Physical Education, Light Weights, and Lifetime Fitness. Mr. Cummins has shared that this changed has been well received by the students. Mr. Cummins expressed his appreciation for the new equipment and locker room that the Middle School has received.



Mrs. Jenny Gentry (pictured right with Board President Todd Wilson) presented to the Board an overview of the Purple and Gold accounts and services that Goppert Bank offers to our community. This is the third year that Goppert Bank has worked with the district to provide a service for students in K-6. Goppert meets with students once a week in the buildings and allows students to make deposits of real money into their Purple and Gold accounts. The Goppert employee assists students by teaching them the value of money and of saving. Once a student has deposited \$10 into their Purple and Gold account, they are invited to open a savings account where deposits can then start to earn interest.

Mr. Brad Steele from Westbrook and Co presented to the Board the final Audit report for the 2022-2023 School year.

Mr. Mike Clevenger presented to the Board an update on the Summer Bond project list and where the district is at on completion of this list.
